1. Causes: e.g.
 - a. Some markets are located far from roads, vendors move to the roads to get closer to customers.
 - b. Lack of enough space in the market; unemployment has increased the number of vendors who cannot be accommodated in small markets. Those lacking space find themselves selling along the roads
 - c. Some customers do not have time to branch off from the roads to the markets for small things; vendors follow such customers so that they make some sales for the day

- b. Sometimes some people find themselves forced to pay for things they stepped on by accident as they try to avoid a vehicle on the roads.
